## Service Notes

- The Trip Planner on the new BRITE website went live this month.
- The Staunton Downtown Trolley and BRCC Shuttles (North and South) operated on Labor Day, Monday, September 3rd.
- Effective Tuesday, September 4th, the Stuarts Draft Link's two-hour mid-day break was closed and service is now continuous from 6:50A-4:43P.
- The Waynesboro Circulator experienced a delay on September 4th due to an accident.
- CSPDC and VRT staff completed the monthly facility inspection on Friday, September 7th.
- The BRITE Transit Advisory Committee meeting scheduled for September 12th was canceled.
- The statewide Try Transit Week, September 17-21, was celebrated by BRITE with free rides on all routes on Wednesday, September 19th.
- On September 21st, BRITE was unable to provide service to Statler Square, Valley View, and the Staunton Mall due to a road closure on Greenville Avenue.
- BRITE operated modified routes September 28th and 29th due to road closures in Downtown Staunton for Queen City Mischief and Magic Weekend.

BRITE participated in the statewide Try Transit Week again this year by offering free rides to all passengers on all routes on Wednesday, September 19th. BRITE passengers took advantage of the day with ridership numbers increasing by 100 riders (comparison from previous Wednesday to free ride Wednesday).

As part of Try Transit Week, the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) sponsors a Try Transit Week pledge giveaway. Participants who pledge to try transit are automatically entered for a chance to win a grand prize of a year of free transit service and a pair of round-trip tickets aboard Amtrak's Northeast Regional train, and regional prizes of free bus passes. This year's area regional winner was Mayor Carolyn Dull of Staunton, and she donated her winnings to New Directions and Valley Community Services Board.
